

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How Can I Prepare For My Procedure?

Your preparation at home before your procedure is extremely important in the success of your procedure.

- PLEASE BRING a list of all medications you take and bring any inhalers you take to Bayview Surgery Center the day of your procedure.
- DO NOT EAT OR DRINK ANYTHING (unless otherwise instructed) after midnight the day preceding your procedure this includes gum and lozenges. Undigested food in the stomach can cause complications and your procedure is likely to be postponed if you forget.
- BATHE OR SHOWER the morning of your procedure to minimize the chance of infection. Teeth may be brushed, but DO NOT swallow any water.
- REFRAIN FROM SMOKING after midnight on the day preceding your procedure.
- IF YOU EXPERIENCE ANY HEALTH
 CHANGES between your most recent visit
 to your doctor and the day of procedure,
 notify your doctor. Please report even minor
 changes, such as an elevated temperature,
 cough or cold, recent or upcoming cardiac
 testing such as stress test or echo cardiogram.
- WEAR COMFORTABLE, LOOSE CLOTHING. During the procedure, you will wear a patient gown provided by the Center.
- ARRANGE FOR AN ADULT TO BE AT THE SURGERY CENTER TO DRIVE YOU, as you cannot drive yourself home after the procedure.
- LEAVE VALUABLES (jewelry and electronic devices) at home as well as contact lenses and body piercings.

What Should I Expect When I Arrive at the Center?

You should arrive at the time that is confirmed by Bayview Surgery Center 24 hours prior to your procedure.

Check in with our receptionist at your scheduled time. We will need your photo identification and insurance at this time. This is the time when any payment due will be collected.

You will be asked to verify your:

- Photo ID
- Insurance
- Payment (if applicable)
- Personal Information
- As well as sign all consent forms

Your doctor performs the procedure with the support of our experienced staff and anesthesia team.

In most cases, an IV will be inserted so you can easily receive intravenous medication that will help you relax,

Plan to be at the center anywhere between 2 and 6 hours depending on the procedure you are having.

ADVANCED DIRECTIVES

It is the responsibility of patients with Advanced Directives to inform their physicians of their wishes and provide a copy to the facility. If you have a healthcare surrogate please provide this information as well.

ANY PROBLEMS THAT OCCUR AFTER YOU ARRIVE HOME should be directed to your doctor's office.

What Happens After My Procedure?

The best part of any procedural experience is going home.

- After your procedure, you'll be transferred to our fully-equipped recovery room where you'll be attended by your anesthetist and recovery room nurses until you're ready to go home.
- The physician will see you post operatively and discuss all instructions/followups.
- The Medical Staff will then discharge you when they are assured you are in stable condition.
- You could still feel sleepy, slightly dizzy, or nauseated. These are possible (and normal) side effects of anesthesia and can last for 12 to 24 hours.
- We will call you to follow up with you after your procedure.
- PLEASE fill out the patient questionnaire form and return to Bayview Surgery Center.

FOLLOWING YOUR PROCEDURE (FOR 24 HOURS) DO NOT:

- Drive
- Operate any heavy equipment
- Sign any important legal papers
- Make any important decisions
- Drink any alcoholic beverages (do not drink any alcoholic beverages while taking medications)
- Take any medicine not prescribed or acknowledged by your doctor
